Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Jesus' kingship is the kingship of one who is dedicated to his Father. He lives and dies for the truth. In his death and resurrection he is enthroned in the glory of his Father. This is the kingship we celebrate: one who has passed through the worst of human life to a life and joy that is eternal.





We see Pilate as a very confused man. He saw in Jesus a good man. The people named Jesus as a king and yet they handed him over to Pilate. A lot about Jesus put off the Jews, his own people, but

they didn't want to punish him.

They would leave that to Pilate and the Romans. To avoid the issue, he got into an argument about what a king would be.

Jesus then said many things about being a king, like 'my Kingdom is not of this world.' His Kingdom is from another place from the heavenly kingdom.

It's good to be reminded of the world of our origins and our goal. We come from God and we go to God.

When we hear that, it can be frightening. It's about what we don't know. But is it not one of the biggest joys in life – that I come from God, I am going to God and in between believe God is with me, God is with us?
