Lectio Divina will take place every Wednesday during Advent after 10 o'clock Mass in the Jubilee Chapel.



Today is the first Sunday of Advent, and the season of Advent calls us into a very special time. It is a time of waiting and preparing for the coming of Christ. We celebrate Christs coming on earth all those years ago, and we are assured that there will be a second coming at the end of the ages, when all that God has planned will be brought to completion.

We are asked to prepare, to be awake, to expect and not to get caught out. In the gospel from St Luke Jesus is speaking with his disciples and he speaks of signs in the sun moon and stars, people bewildered by all that is happening, and the powers of heaven shaken. The things we relied on are being challenged but Jesus says do not be afraid, hold your heads high, stand erect, your liberation is near at hand. God is very close to you even in the midst of great challenges.

Jesus reminds his disciples that is easy to become coarsened and hardened by some of the experiences of life and seeking comfort in the things of life. This is not the road to follow. Jesus says, stay awake, praying for the strength to survive all that is going to happen and stand with confidence before the Son of Man. Come to God with all that is in your life and in your heart and know that God is with us, Amen.

THE ADVENT WREATH

The circle of evergreen leaves stands for God who is without beginning and without end.
The purple ribbon

and three purple candles stand for penance and sorrow for sin.

The red candle stands for joy of living in God's way of love.

Today the first purple candle is lit as we begin our preparations for the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Advent calls on us, as we await the birth of Jesus to be a light for all who hunger for justice, peace and truth.





As we take our first steps into Advent, the message is to stay awake! In today's Gospel we meet Jesus towards the end of his ministry, instructing the disciples to be aware of the signs of the times and to stay 'alert'. It is a

message designed to keep his followers on their toes.

It can be easy for us to fall into a comfortable rut, not really engaging with the wider world. And when we do look up, we notice "the worries of this life": in the natural world, in troubled countries, in our church, even our own families. But what would happen if we were to truly wake up? We can think of many people who are awake to the problems in society. One person who embodies this spirit is climate activist Greta Thunberg. Her 'School Strike for Climate' began in 2018 with her sitting alone outside the Swedish Parliament, and has grown into a worldwide movement of young people calling for action to address climate change. People like this are 'awake' to the world around them – their eyes are open, they see the injustices and they have acted. They are forging a brighter future. Countless others are reaching out, speaking against injustice, working to heal wounds in the natural world, in communities and families. We can't afford to sleepwalk through life when the Gospel challenges us to be bearers of hope and good news. This Advent, we are called to be awake. As we begin this journey, think of a time when you felt truly 'awake' to events around you. Can you become more awake to the Gospel alive and active in the world?

Awakening to the realities of the world or even of our own lives can be a painful experience. As Greta says, hope is found in action, in small steps. What small step can you take this week?
