Adoration Chapel


The Adoration Chapel is currently closed for Christmas and the New Year. It will re-open on the Monday January 6th as per normal.

FIRST READING 1 Samuel 1:20-22.24-28 A reading from the first book of Samuel

Hannah conceived and gave birth to a son, and

called him Samuel. 'since' she said 'I asked the Lord for him.'

When a year had gone by, the husband Elkanah went up again with all his family to offer the annual sacrifice to the Lord and to fulfil his vow. Hannah, however, did not go up, having said to her husband, 'not before the child is weaned. Then I will bring him and present him before the Lord and he shall stay there for ever.'

When she had weaned him, she took him up with her together with a three-year-old bull, an ephah of flour and a skin of wine, and she brought him to the temple of the Lord at Shiloh; and the child was with them. They slaughtered the bull, and the child's mother came to Eli.

GOSPEL Luke 2: 41-52

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Every year the parents of Jesus used to go to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up for the feast as usual. When they were on their way home after the feast, the boy Jesus staved behind in Jerusalem without his parents knowing it. They assumed he was with the caravan, and it was only after a day's journey that they went to look for him among their

relations and acquaintances. When they failed to find they went back to Jerusalem looking for him evervwhere.

Three days later, they found him in the Temple, sitting among the doctors, listening to them, and asking them questions; and all those who heard him were astounded at his intelligence and his replies. They were overcome when they saw him, and his mother said to him, 'My child, why have you done this to us? See how worried your father and I have been, looking for you.' 'Why were you looking for me?' he replied. 'Did you not know that I must be busy with my Father's affairs?' But they did not understand what he meant.

He then went down with them and came to Nazareth and lived under their authority. His mother stored up all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favour with God and men.

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

AFTER THE CONSECRATION My Lord and my God.

A day to pray with and for our family; to give thanks to God for them; to pray for healing of divisions and bitterness. We pray that we may grow in respect and love for our extended family throughout the world.





Today's Gospel is the only account in the canonical Gospels where we get a glimpse of Jesus as a young boy. Jesus and his family are on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem for the Festival of Passover. As a 12-year-

old Jewish boy, Jesus would have been encouraged to begin to take on the responsibilities of an adult Jew. Here, we read that Jesus takes this commitment quite seriously, remaining behind to interact with the teachers in the Temple who are "amazed" at his understanding. Jesus "increased in wisdom" so although we are not told anything else of Jesus' adolescent years, we can assume he continued to ask questions, learned from wise teachers and observed the signs of his times. Jesus was not zapped and suddenly enlightened. He more than likely had to study, mature, and enter into deep reflection.

Jesus, as a young person, is beginning to shape his identity. As with all families, this can cause difficulties. Parents want to protect their children; adolescents want to explore and expand their horizons. Conflict ensues. One must wonder if Mary's heart sank at Jesus' response to her "Did you not know that I must be about my Father's business?" Today's Gospel is a reminder of the helplessness we experience at times when we must let God's dream be dreamed, in ourselves and for those we love. Sometimes we have to let people we love walk their own path and follow the way God has set out for them. Mary has been reminded of the Divine will that surrounds her son and once again she treasures "all these things in her heart". So, today, we thank God for our families, we acknowledge that family relationships can be complicated, we pray for families everywhere. In all the complexities that life brings for families, may we be open to discovering God's path for each one.
